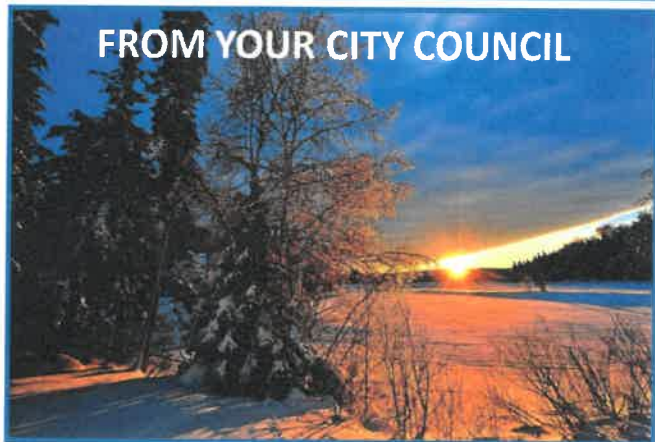

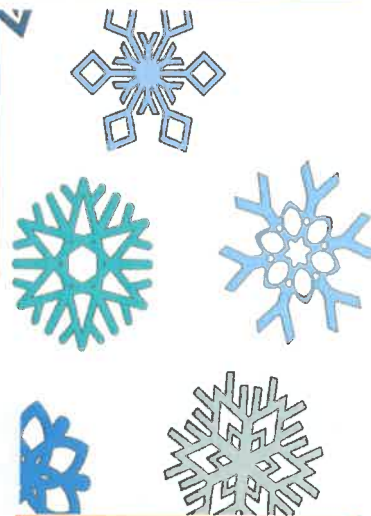

Gardening Tip: Time of Day to Water

The best time to water is in the morning, when the
air is cooler and there is usually less wind. This
allows your plants to absorb the most water be-
fore the hottest part of the day.

While watering early in the day is best, it is im-
portant to water plants whenever they need it. If
the soil is dry and your plants are wilting, water as
soon as you can.

Keep Our Water Safe –

Cross Connection Notice (Ord. no. 402)

To protect Grass Valley's drinking water, the City requires all properties to prevent **cross connections**—any link between our water system and another source (like irrigation or wells).

If you have:

- A sprinkler system or pool
- A private well or alternate water source
- Certain commercial setups

You may need a **backflow prevention device**, tested **annually** by a certified tester. Property owners are responsible for installation, maintenance, and submitting test results.

Why?

Backflow can let unsafe water into the city system. This ordinance helps keep our water clean and safe for all.

August Gardening Tips:

Flowers & Pollinators

Deadhead spent blooms to encourage more flowers.

Water hanging baskets and containers **daily** if it's hot.

Plant **perennials** in late August for fall root development.

Prep for Fall & Winter

Start planning your **fall garden cleanup**.

Begin **dividing perennials** (like iris and daylilies) at the end of the month.

Pests

Use **organic controls** like neem oil or insecticidal soap when necessary.

September Garden Tip:

Prep for Fall, Protect for Winter..

As the days cool, it's time to:

- **Harvest** late crops like winter squash and potatoes before frost hits.
- **Mulch** root veggies like carrots and beets for winter harvesting.
- **Plant** spring-blooming bulbs like daffodils and tulips—add bone meal or bulb fertilizer for strong roots.
- **Divide** perennials like iris and peonies to keep them thriving.
- **Reduce watering** on trees and shrubs to help them harden off before winter.

Bonus tip: Pick green tomatoes if frost threatens and let them ripen indoors!

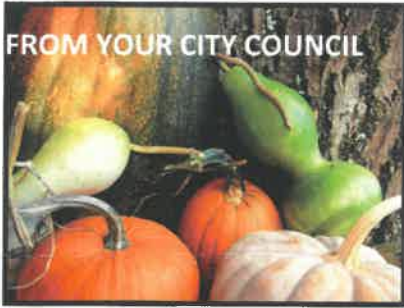

Caring for Animals, Respecting Neighbors

Animal Ordinance Reminder (Ord.# 400-24)

(There has been Many Complaints)

Per **Section 37 – Animals at Large**, animals such as chickens and livestock may not be allowed to run at large or create a nuisance (trespassing, scattering garbage, or causing repeated noise). Under **Section 39 – Livestock** and **Section 40 – Fowl and Small Animals**, chickens, livestock, and other small animals must always be kept in a sanitary, enclosed coop or pen. If valid complaints are received or pens are not properly maintained, the owner will have 10 days to correct the issue. Failure to comply may result in the City arranging removal of the animals at the owner's expense.



October Garden Tips:

Garden Cleanup & Prep

- **Harvest the last warm-season crops** (tomatoes, squash, peppers) before frost hits.
- **Pull out annuals** and spent veggie plants to prevent pests/disease from overwintering.
- **Add compost or well-aged manure** to beds now — it'll break down over winter and enrich soil for spring.
- **Mulch garden beds** (straw, leaves, or bark) to protect roots and soil.

Frost & Winter Protection

- Be ready for **frost blankets or row covers** — October nights dip quickly.
- **Lift and store tender bulbs** (like dahlias, cannas, gladiolus).
- **Drain and store hoses** before hard freezes.
- Protect young trees/shrubs from deer and rodents with fencing or wraps.

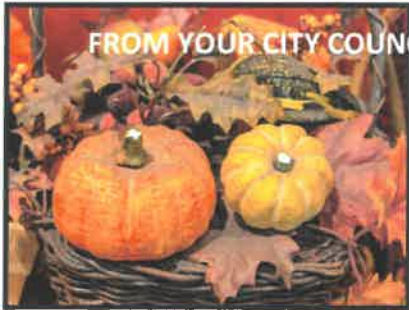

November : Gardening and Landscape Tips:

Lawns—*Rake leaves off grass to prevent mold and smothering. *Fertilize lightly with a slow-release winter formula —it helps root growth before dormancy.

Trees & Shrubs *Water before the freeze: Give your trees and shrubs a deep soaking early in the month if the ground isn't frozen yet. *Prune lightly: Remove dead or diseased branches, but save major pruning for late winter or early spring when plants are fully dormant. *Plant dormant trees and shrubs: If the ground is still workable, November is a good time to plant bare-root or container-grown natives.

Perennials & Flower Beds *Add mulch: Apply 2-4 inches of bark chips, straw, or shredded leaves around perennials to insulate roots. *Divide and transplant late-blooming perennials now if the soil isn't frozen.

Keep your landscape winter-ready! *Water trees and shrubs only if the ground isn't frozen and protect young plants with burlap or guards. *Mulch perennials and bulbs to insulate roots, and leave seed heads for birds. *Remove heavy leaves from lawns and avoid walking on frozen grass. *Winterize tools, clear gutters, and protect furniture. *Keep bird feeders full and provide some leaf litter for wildlife habitat.
