September Gardening Tips:

- **Keep watering—even when it cools down.** Trees, shrubs, and perennials still need moisture going into fall, especially after a dry summer.
- **Plant for spring color.** September is a good time to start thinking about planting spring-flowering bulbs such as daffodils, tulips, and crocus.
- **Divide crowded perennials.** Established plants such as iris and daylilies can often be divided as temperatures cool.
- **Don't clean up everything!** Leaving some seed heads and plant stems through fall can provide food and shelter for birds and beneficial insects.
- **Get ahead of weeds.** Pulling weeds before they drop seed can save a surprising amount of work next spring.
- **Protect your harvest from an early frost.** Grass Valley can get chilly quickly in the fall, so gardeners should keep an eye on nighttime temperatures and be ready to cover tomatoes, peppers, and other tender vegetables.
- **Plant a little fall color.** Pansies and other cool-season flowers can brighten containers and beds after summer annuals begin fading.

Zoning & Housing Update

The City has begun work on a **Housing Planning Assistance Grant** to review and update portions of Grass Valley's Comprehensive Plan and Zoning Ordinance related to housing.

As part of the project, a local Advisory Committee is working with our planning consultant to review existing zoning rules, learn about current state housing requirements, and look at different housing options that may be a good fit for Grass Valley.

Over the next several months, the project will include community interviews, an online survey, and opportunities for public input. Draft zoning and Comprehensive Plan changes will be developed and reviewed before any proposed amendments are brought to the City Council for consideration.

The goal is to make sure our planning documents meet current state requirements while also considering the housing needs and character of our community.
