September Garden Tip: Prep for Fall, Protect for Winter..

As the days cool, it's time to:

- •Harvest late crops like winter squash and potatoes before frost hits.
- •Mulch root veggies like carrots and beets for winter harvesting.
- •Plant spring-blooming bulbs like daffodils and tulips—add bone meal or bulb fertilizer for strong roots.
- •Divide perennials like iris and peonies to keep them thriving.
- •Reduce watering on trees and shrubs to help them harden off before winter.

Bonus tip: Pick green tomatoes if frost threatens and let them ripen indoors!
