## Resolution

This matter comes before the above entitled City Council at a regular scheduled meeting on February 3, 2003, involving the declaration of the need for senior housing and supporting the 12-unit senior housing project proposed by Mid-Columbia Housing Authority.

WHEREAS, There is currently no Senior Housing available in Sherman County; and

WHEREAS, many of the homes in Sherman County are old, multi-level, sub-standard, narrow hallways with steep stairs, require high maintenance and are poorly insulated resulting in high heating bills; and

WHEREAS, when senior citizens reach a point that they have difficulty with house or yard maintenance, going up and down stairs or find it necessary to use a walker or wheelchair, they often need to move out of the county to find appropriate housing accommodations, and

WHEREAS, it is very difficult for senior citizens to leave a community that they have lived in most of their lives and leave behind family and friends; and

WHEREAS, The closest senior housing available is 40-60 miles away; and

WHEREAS, Mid-Columbia Housing Authority has proposed to build a 12-unit senior housing facility that will enable senior citizens to remain in the community; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Moro City Council declares the need for senior housing in Sherman County and supports the 12-unit senior housing project proposed by Mid-Columbia Housing Authority.
